ABOUT THE SCHOLARSHIP

dams Center native **John Shaw McNeely** established the **Shaw Harbor Foundation** as a permanent charitable fund of the **Northern New York Community Foundation** in 2017 to provide educational support to students who want to change the world. Students awarded a Shaw Harbor Scholarship are selected by a committee in their senior year of high school through a competitive process that includes a written application, essay, and interview. Shaw Harbor scholars are awarded support for their first year of post-secondary education. Several special Shaw Harbor scholarships are also awarded annually, including the Equity & Justice Award, the STEM Award, the World-Changer Award, and the Distinguished Undergraduate Award. Students are eligible for educational awards through their entire academic journey, which could extend to graduate school and include overseas study and internships with John's company and its affiliates.



After many years of international travel and growing the business, John sold the company in 2019 and began to plan how he
